Recycling needs to be **CLEAN, DRY, and LOOSE!**

<b>Paper</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Clean paper</li> <li>• Magazines</li> <li>• Newspapers</li> <li>• Junk mail</li> <li>• Catalogues</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Shredded paper</li> <li>• Gift wrap</li> <li>• Laminated paper</li> <li>• Tissues/napkins/paper towels</li> <li>• Receipts</li> <li>• Photos</li> <li>• Wallpaper</li> </ul>
<b>Cardboard</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cereal packets</li> <li>• Food boxes</li> <li>• Greetings cards (no glitter)</li> <li>• Toilet roll tubes</li> <li>• Corrugated card</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Greasy food boxes</li> <li>• Boxes containing plastic or foam packaging</li> </ul>
<b>Plastics</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• PETE plastics *</li> <li>• HDPE plastics *</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Spray and pump dispensers</li> <li>• Plastic pots, tubs, punnets, and trays</li> <li>• Cling film</li> <li>• Plastic bags</li> </ul>
<b>Tins and cans</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Clean food tins</li> <li>• Drinks cans</li> <li>• Pet food tins</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Tins with food residue</li> <li>• Paint tins</li> <li>• Other metals or metallic packaging</li> </ul>
<b>Aerosols</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Empty aerosol cans</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Lids</li> <li>• Full (or part full) aerosol cans</li> </ul>



\* These are usually marked with **PETE** or **HDPE** and include many food and drink bottles (preferably with lids on) detergent bottles, and toiletries – always check the label to be certain!

## What can I do with...?

<b>Plastic carrier bags</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Aim to reuse</li> </ul>
<b>Glass bottles and jars</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Kerbside collection box</li> <li>• Local bottle banks (The Robin Hood, Durley; Jubilee Hall, Bishops Waltham)</li> </ul>
<b>Textiles, clothes, and shoes</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Local collection points (Durley Memorial Hall; Household Recycling Centre, Fair Oak)</li> <li>• Charity shops will accept good quality textiles clothes and shoes</li> <li>• Reuse old clothes and textiles as cleaning cloths etc.</li> </ul>
<b>Aluminium kitchen foil</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If contaminated with food waste, this cannot be recycled</li> <li>• If foil stays scrunched when squashed it is likely recyclable - aim to scrunch into a tennis sized ball and take to the local recycling centre</li> </ul>
<b>Tetrapaks/cartons</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Local collection points (Colden Common Community Centre; Valley Park Community Centre, Chandlers Ford; New Alresford Station Car Park)</li> </ul>
<b>Soft plastics (items marked 'recycle with carrier bags at larger stores') i.e. bread bags, pouches etc.</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Local collection points (M&amp;S, Eastleigh; M&amp;S, Hedge End; Sainsbury's, Hedge End; Sainsbury's, Badger Farm; Waitrose, Chandlers Ford; Waitrose, Locks Heath; Waitrose, Winchester; more details on <a href="http://recyclenow.com">recyclenow.com</a>)</li> </ul>
<b>Medicinal blister packs</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Can be recycled at Superdrug Pharmacies (Romsey, Fareham, Woolston, Bittern, and Basingstoke)</li> <li>• Jane Ashe (<a href="mailto:janeashe42@yahoo.co.uk">janeashe42@yahoo.co.uk</a>) has a friend who can take these to Romsey - get in touch with Jane to see how to do this!</li> </ul>
<b>Electricals</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Can be taken to various local recycling centres - Household Waste Recycling Centres in Fair Oak, Bishops Waltham, Winchester, and Hedge End</li> <li>• Can also be collected with home recycling - see <a href="http://recyclenow.com">recyclenow.com</a></li> </ul>
